

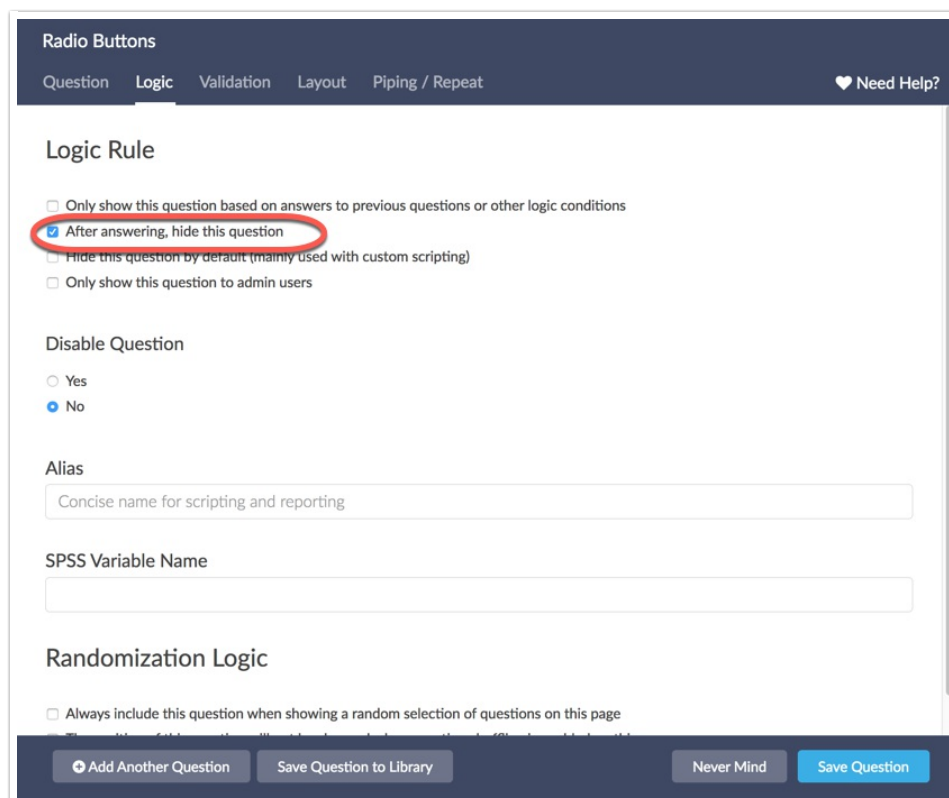
Hide After Answering

At times you may want to discourage your survey respondents from changing their answers. Alchemer has a feature that will help you accomplish this by automatically hiding a question once it is answered. This can be particularly helpful if you are using Alchemer to create a Quiz.

Note: This feature is only available for the Radio Button Question Type.

Hiding an Answered Question

1. Edit the target question you wish to hide after it is answered.
2. Go to the **Logic** tab and click the **After answering, hide this question** option.
3. **Save the Question**, it's that easy!

With this setting applied, the questions will hide directly after an answer is selected. It may be helpful to add a note to your survey alerting your respondents of this behavior so they are not caught off guard.
