

Limit Ranked Items in Ranking Questions

By default, Ranking Grid questions will create the same number of columns as rows headers. This means that your results will rank each item (row) from highest to lowest.

If you prefer to gather the top 3 ranked items, you can do so by customizing the number of columns in your ranking questions. This trick works for Drag & Drop Ranking questions too!

Setup

1. Edit your question and click the **Validation** tab.
2. Enter the maximum number of columns you would like to display in the **Limit answers to** field.
3. Click **Save Question**.

Your question will now reflect the number of column headers you indicated. For Drag & Drop Ranking

In the examples above, because we are limiting the number of items to rank to 3, the weighted sum for an option that was placed in the first position (1) would be worth 3. The table below shows the formula for computing the total rank for each answer option/row header:

<u>Total Responses</u>		<u>Weight</u>		
Rank 1 Count	x	3	=	
Rank 2 Count	x	2	=	
Rank 3 Count	x	1	=	
			+	Total Score (Answer Option X)

If you had a limit of 5 instead, then answer options chosen as Rank of 1 would be given a weighted value of 5 points, Rank 2 would be weighted 4 points and so on.

Unranked items are given a score of 0.
